The Fountain of Youth discovered at Gibson Center

I define the "Fountain of Youth" as one thing that a person can do to turn back the clock on aging, giving one the mind and body of someone much younger. And where can one find this magic pill, this elixir of life? The Gibson Center offers you many opportunities to turn back the hands of time. Most people are aware that mild to moderate exercise (as defined as walking, dancing, swimming, yoga, moderate weight training) helps with weight control, balance, bone density, and cardio-vascular health. But did you know that being able to stand and walk also could save your life? What if there were a fire, would you be able to safely self evacuate? People who exercise have better balance and are therefore more likely to be able to self evacuate in case of disaster.

But the "Fountain of Youth" must also return one's brain to the quicker thinking of younger people, or at least slow the process of decline. At the July 14, 2014 Alzheimer's Association International Conference, Yonas E. Geda, MD MSC from the Mayo Clinic offered scientific proof that participating in mild to moderate exercise reduces the risk of Mild Cognitive Impairment, and slows the process of Alzheimer's Symptoms.




